#### **Village Precept**

Councillors have given lengthy consideration to the budget for the financial year 2025-26 and have agreed a budget of £111,569. Costs to the Council have grown with a significant increase in grounds maintenance charges at the Recreation Ground. The rising cost of energy has also impacted on finances and the footway lighting grant has been withdrawn. The budget includes an allowance for increased maintenance at the Recreation Ground, Pavilion and Cemetery. The Parish Council will continue to act with due diligence in its finances and will seek competitive tenders and pursue grants to help with costs.

A precept of £61,671 has been set and this is a 3per cent increase adding £1.68pa to a Band D property. equating to 3p per week. The Council has healthy reserves and will draw on this rather than increase the burden on Council Tax payers.





#### **Newington History Group**

**School 175:** This year marks the 175th anniversary of Newington CE Primary School and the history group is heavily involved in helping it celebrate its historic milestone.

The group would love to hear from you if you're a former pupil with an interesting memory or story about the school whether it's a recent memory or one from decades ago. Email newingtonhistorygroup@outlook.com.

There will be special events throughout the year following the official launch at the school's crib service on December 13. The most immediate visible sign will be a banner hung outside the school proclaiming the school's 175-year existence, from 1850-2025. The banner will remain until the end of the year.

Special events, exhibitions, productions and parties will be held throughout 2025 involving the whole village, including current and former pupils.

NHG works closely with the school in helping the children learn about and appreciate their local history.

**Heritage Support:** NHG holds monthly talks throughout the year, except for January and August.

Held in the Village Hall on the fourth Thursday (third Thurs in Dec.) at 7pm, all the talks are about an aspect of Kent's history and are an opportunity to socialise.

NHG is for the whole village but also attracts members and visitors from further afield.

The list of speakers for this year shows a wide range of entertaining and informative subjects. The talks are open to all and there's no need to book. It costs £4 at the door which includes light refreshments, but you get in free if you're a NHG member.

In addition, your membership supports Newington's heritage and our community work.

Annual membership for adults is \$18 – a mere \$1.50 a month – and runs from June 1.

You can join now for \$7.50, with an adult membership which expires at the end of May.

If you're a young person with an interest in your community's heritage, ask about the group's free membership for under-18s and the special young member concession for 18–25-year-olds.

The group is here to research, promote and help protect the history and heritage of the village and neighbouring areas. It liaises with heritage and archaeological experts in recording the village for the future.

Visit the Romano-British temple at Watling Place and find out about the Roman industrial town that covered the estate or walk across the World War One defence line at Cranbrook and Wormdale, where you can read our on-site information boards.

You can explore the village's countryside and heritage by following rural paths to be found on the NHG website at newingtonhistory.uk/walks.

And the group works closely with the village school enabling the children to learn about and appreciate their local history.

**Year of Talks:** The year of NHG talks starts with the history of Kemsley Paper Mill told by Clare Marshall on February 27 and will be followed on March 27 by songs that feature Kent in A Kentish Songster delivered by Doug Hudson, who is an entertainer and the stadium announcer at Gillingham football club.

#### Rogue Traders/Bogus Tradesmen

Bogus tradesmen, door-to-door sales or doorstep fraud involves fraudsters trying to scam you after knocking at your door.

Legitimate doorstep selling involves someone selling you goods or services in your home or on your doorstep. Many honest businesses use this technique – but so do fraudsters.

Buying on your doorstep can be convenient. However, a salesman who uses clever tactics can pressurise you into buying something you actually don't want or something that's poor value for money.

Door-to-door frauds can take many forms, including:

- pressure selling
- unfair contracts
- overpriced or substandard home maintenance or improvements
- phoney consumer surveys
- bogus charity collections.



Such frauds involve promoting goods or services that are either never delivered to you or are of a very poor quality. Fraudsters may also bill you for work that you didn't agree to. There are specific laws about door-to-door sales. Many are required to give you a 'cooling-off' period (where you can change your mind or request your money back). Bogus tradesmen will offer none of these, and even if they do, you can be sure their 'guarantee' will not be honoured.

Bogus salespeople will provide false identity or contact information, making it impossible for you to identify or contact them. If you've paid them in advance, you won't get your money back.

Even if your bank or insurance policy covers any loss, you'll still have to contend with a damaged credit rating, continued correspondence over a prolonged period to repair the damage, and the emotional distress and anxiety identity theft can cause.

Also, be wary of opening your door to a potential burglar or someone who wants to get inside your property to enable other people to break in. Once they get through your door, fraudulent salespeople can take note of your valuables and any security measures you have in place.

#### The victims

Victims are often vulnerable, elderly and/or isolated people who know nothing of these scams and so are trusting of anyone who is friendly or seems knowledgeable and genuine. After they have become a victim, they often feel ashamed and/or scared and so don't tell anyone. This not only means the original scam goes unreported but it also makes it easy for the rogue trader to return for more. The stress of the victim's shame or fear may also go on to cause physical or mental health problems. And even if the traders are reported they are often untraceable as they will have given the victim false contact details or none at all.

#### Are you a victim of bogus tradesmen fraud?

- You've bought faulty, overpriced or substandard goods or services from someone knocking at your door.
- You've paid for these goods or services by credit or debit card.

#### What should you do if you've been a victim of bogus tradesmen fraud?

- Report it to Action Fraud.
- You can report the salesperson to the Citizens Advice on 0808 223 1133. or to the National Trading
- Standards if you believe they have sold you faulty, inferior or overpriced products or services. Similarly, you can seek advice from Citizens Advice about the terms and conditions of any agreement or contract you may have signed.
- If you've made the payment by credit/debit card or by cheque, contact your credit card company and/or bank and advise them that you're a victim of improper door-to-door sales techniques and your identity or financial details may have been compromised. They'll advise you on cancelling payments and ensuring your finances remain secure.

#### RECYCLING INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS



#### What is contamination?

- It is placing non-recyclable materials or items into your blue recycling bin/clear sacks.
- It is placing items into your recycling bin/clear sacks which have not been emptied or rinsed well enough.
- Placing recycling in black sacks is also classed as contamination as we are unable to see the contents inside the bag. Placing recycling into the bin loosely is preferred, please do not use carrier bags or white sacks to dispose of your recycling in your blue bin.

Please help by following the 3 Simple Steps to getting your recycling right:

- STICK TO THE DRY RECYCLING LIST ONLY: Paper and cardboard, glass bottles and jars, metal food and drinks cans, foil, plastic bottles, tubs, pots and trays
- MAKE SURE ALL RECYCLING IS CLEAN BEFORE IT GOES INTO YOUR RECYCLING BIN/CLEAR SACKS: You do not need to use clean water for this. Once you have finished washing up, just give the recycling a quick rinse before putting it in your blue bin or pop it in your dishwasher!
- DO NOT PUT ANY OF THE TOP 4 CONTAMINATES IN YOUR RECYCLING BIN/CLEAR SACKS
  - 1. Nappies/Sanitary Items
  - 2. Textiles/Electrical Items
  - 3. Black sacks (we cannot empty bins where recycling is in black sacks)
  - 4. Food/Unclean containers

#### Bank Impersonation/Courier Fraud

We have received reports where victims are being targeted by criminals impersonating their Bank. They will state they are from their Banks Fraud TO STOP FRAUD Department and that they are passing them through to the "Fraud Squad" as their Bank account is being used for Fraud. They will ask them to withdraw cash as part of an investigation and to post the money to an address that the criminals supply. The Scam appears all very plausible and is designed to panic the victims into complying with the criminals wishes.

Your Bank or Police will never call like this and ask you to withdraw cash to be posted to an address or to be collected by a courier.

If you get a call like this and are unsure, then STOP. Get their details and then call 159 for your Banks Fraud Department or 101 for the Police but using a different telephone to the one that you were originally called on. If you do not have a different telephone to hand, then wait 5 minutes and ring a family member or friend to ensure the line has been disconnected.

#### HMRC Scams are on the increase

TO STOP FRAUD We have received reports recently of criminals impersonating HMRC and telephoning people stating that they owed money for back tax or a fine and that unless paid immediately they would send the Police to arrest them. They will often tell you to pay this by Bank Transfer or to buy gift cards and to call them with the gift card numbers.

It is a SCAM - HMRC would never call you like this and will never threaten you with arrest.

#### **Delivery Scams Happening Now**

We have received reports of Kent residents receiving packages addressed to them but found that they contained items that they had not ordered. A short while after the packages were delivered a courier is reported to have reattended their address to collect the packages, claiming they had been delivered in error and that they will take them back for them.

However, it is a scam. As the criminals have ordered the goods and then arranged delivery to the victim in the victim's name and to the victim's home address, with the criminals then collecting the goods stating that they were delivered by mistake.

The first time the victim knows that there is a problem, is when they are contacted for payment of the goods. Often the items ordered are high value Mobile Phones and Laptops.

If goods are delivered that you have not ordered and are marked with your address, then you should inform the company that sent it and wait for them to send a courier. Always check with them which courier company is making the collection and when they will arrive. If someone knocks on the door claiming to have come to pick it up after it was delivered by mistake, then do not hand the items over.





